

Bachelor's Degree in Chaplaincy and Ministerial Care

Program Presentation

The Bachelor's Degree in Chaplaincy and Ministerial Care at the Universidad Católica Americana (UNICA) constitutes an integral educational proposal that unites the Christian tradition of pastoral care (*cura animarum*) applied to human contexts such as hospitals, armed forces, educational and penitentiary institutions, where the Church exercises its vocation of accompaniment.

In the biblical and ecclesial tradition, ministerial care is the service of spiritual and emotional

accompaniment as an expression of faith and charity. In the Church, this ministry has historically manifested itself through spiritual direction, pastoral counseling, and consoling presence in moments ofcrisis and need. This vocation of accompaniment is renewed in the contemporary context through chaplaincy, a professional discipline oriented toward spiritual well-being, human dignity, and support within institutional environments. The Bachelor's Degree in Chaplaincy and Ministerial Care at UNICA offers an interdisciplinary education that combines theology, psychology, counseling, and pastoral professionals capable ministry, preparing • Understanding spiritual and emotional needs from a Christian and compassionate perspective. • Intervening in situations of crisis, grief, and vulnerability with pastoral sensitivity and methodological rigor. • Accompanying processes of faith and discernment in diverse contexts (medical, military, educational), uniting emotional support and evangelizing mission. • Leading programs of spiritual care, reconciliation, and the promotion of integral well-being local and global contexts. in Thanks to its virtual and blended modality, the program is accessible to students from various contexts, who may carry out ministerial and chaplaincy practices in their places of residence or in affiliated institutions. Likewise, its bilingual offering (Spanish and English) opens doors serve in multicultural communities and international environments. Methodology and Evaluation

• Blended Methodology:

The program combines synchronous and asynchronous classes, practical counseling workshops, intensive seminars, and field practices in chaplaincy and ministerial institutions.

• Continuous Evaluation:

Assessment is based on case studies, pastoral intervention plans, theological essays, supervised practices, applied research, and the defense of the final thesis or service project.

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• Bilingual Evaluation:

In the bilingual modality, students will be assessed on social and linguistic competencies in both languages (Spanish and English), ensuring proficiency for professional ministry in multicultural environments.
