Admission Requirements (Profile and Documentation)

- Recognized High School Diploma or equivalent (GED).
- Secondary school transcript / academic record.
- Personal essay (motivation letter and vocational discernment).
- Admission interview (academic and vocational).
- One pastoral or academic recommendation.
- Demonstration of language proficiency according to modality (see language section).
- For international students: compliance with current immigration and/or visa requirements.
- The university may include additional requirements in accordance with institutional and accreditation standards.

Formative Purpose

To train pastoral counselors capable of integrating the contributions of psychology, theology, and Christian spirituality to accompany individuals, families, and communities in processes of healing, guidance, and integral development, promoting mental health, spiritual wellbeing, and community reconciliation.

- 8. Exercise pastoral leadership in human and spiritual accompaniment projects.
