

Bachelor's Degree in Sacred Music

Program Overview

The Bachelor's Degree in Sacred Music at the Universidad Católica Americana (UNICA) is an academic and formative program that responds to the Church's rich tradition of cultivating musical art as a privileged means of prayer, liturgy, and evangelization.

From the Psalms of the Old Testament to Gregorian chant, chorales, polyphony, and contemporary compositions, sacred music has accompanied the spiritual life of the People of God, expressing faith through artistic forms that elevate the soul and strengthen communion. The Church, aware of this treasure, has throughout the centuries promoted the formation of musicians, singers, and composers capable of integrating artistic excellence with liturgical and pastoral service.

The program integrates three major formative dimensions:

- 1. Musical-Artistic: Music theory, vocal and instrumental technique, choral conducting, and composition.
- 2. Theological-Liturgical: Biblical, theological, and liturgical foundations of sacred music.
- 3. Pastoral-Evangelizing: Musical animation in liturgical celebrations, parish life, and missionary projects.

Thanks to its virtual and blended modality, students can receive academic formation at a distance and participate in intensive in-person workshops and sessions focused on musical and liturgical practice. The bilingual offering (Spanish and English) allows for the preparation of sacred musicians capable of serving in multicultural and international contexts.

The Bachelor's in Sacred Music aims to form professionals who unite art, faith, and pastoral service, enriching the Church's liturgical life, preserving musical heritage, and fostering new compositions that respond to the challenges of contemporary evangelization.

Admission Requirements (Profile and Documentation)

- Recognized High School Diploma or equivalent (GED).
- Transcript / Academic record from secondary education.
- Personal essay (statement of motivation and vocational-artistic discernment).
- Admission interview, including a musical aptitude test.
- Pastoral or academic recommendation.
- Proof of language proficiency according to program modality (see language section).
- For international students: compliance with current migration and/or visa requirements.
- The university may include additional requirements according to institutional and accreditation regulations.

To train professionals in sacred music who integrate artistic excellence with Christian faith, prepared for liturgical, pastoral, educational, and evangelizing service, contributing to the spiritual enrichment of the Church.

- 8. Integrate digital and technological tools in the creation and dissemination of sacred music.

Methodology and Evaluation

- Blended methodology: Virtual classes (synchronous/asynchronous), intensive inperson workshops, and liturgical-musical practices.
- Continuous assessment: Musical performances, composition projects, supervised practices, academic essays, applied research, and final project defense.
- In the bilingual modality, artistic and linguistic competencies are assessed in both languages.
