#### **Admission Requirements (Profile and Documentation)**

- Recognized High School Diploma (or equivalent GED).
- Academic transcript or record of secondary education.
- Personal essay (motivation and vocational discernment letter).
- Admission interview (academic and vocational).
- One pastoral or academic recommendation.
- Proof of language proficiency according to modality (see Language Requirements):
  - o For English track: official English proficiency (e.g., TOEFL, IELTS, or equivalent) if the applicant is not a native speaker.
  - For Spanish track (for international students): possible DELE certification or institutional equivalent.
- For international students: compliance with current migration and visa requirements.
- The university may establish additional requirements according to institutional and accreditation policies.

To form leaders with a solid theological foundation—biblical, systematic, historical, and moral—along with pastoral skills and research capacity, prepared for teaching, ministry, community service, faith communication, and ecumenical/interreligious dialogue.

Upon graduation, the Bachelor of Theology graduate will be able to:

- 1. Interpret biblical texts using historical-critical and theological methods.
- 2. Present and apply Catholic doctrine in its dogmatic, sacramental, and moral dimensions.
- 3. Formulate Christian ethical judgments on contemporary issues.
- 4. Develop and present theological research using appropriate methodology.
- 5. Communicate the faith clearly in pastoral and academic contexts.
- 6. Integrate spiritual life and ministerial praxis.
- 7. Develop pastoral ministries and participate in ecumenical and interreligious dialogue processes.

#### **Competencies**

- Generic: Critical thinking, oral and written communication, teamwork, pastoral leadership, digital competence, intercultural sensitivity.
- Specific: Biblical interpretation, dogmatic theology, Church history, moral and social ethics, homiletics, theological research, and basic proficiency in biblical languages (Latin, Greek; optional Hebrew).

## **Language Offer and Requirements**

The program is offered in three linguistic modalities:

- 1. Spanish Track: Teaching and evaluation in Spanish.
  - Requirement for non-native speakers: certification of Spanish proficiency (e.g., DELE B2 or institutional equivalent) or completion of the academic Spanish course offered by UNICA.
- 2. English Track: Teaching and evaluation in English.
  - Requirement for non-native speakers: certification of English proficiency (e.g., TOEFL iBT, IELTS, or Duolingo) according to institutional policy. (Suggested benchmark:  $TOEFL\ iBT \ge 79-80\ or\ IELTS \ge 6.5$ ; the university will define the official minimum.)
  - o Some readings, assignments, and projects may require engagement with English-language sources.
- 3. Bilingual Track (ES–EN): The curriculum may be completed partially in Spanish and partially in English.
  - o Definition: at least 50% of total coursework (by credits) in a second language.

- o Requirement: certification of proficiency in both languages (institutional minimum levels).
- o The capstone project may be presented in either language, provided the jury and regulations allow it; in the bilingual modality, a translated or summarized version in the complementary language may be required.

Biblical Languages: The curriculum includes mandatory courses in Latin and Biblical Greek (with an option for Biblical Hebrew). For students who are not proficient in the chosen language of instruction, UNICA offers academic English or Spanish support courses as complementary or elective reinforcement options.
