

Master of Arts in Christian Education (M.A.C.E.)

Program Overview

The Master of Arts in Christian Education (M.A.C.E.) at the Universidad Católica Americana (UNICA) is a rigorous graduate program designed to prepare leaders, administrators, and scholars in the pedagogical praxis of faith. This program focuses on the critical intersection between theological depth and contemporary educational methodologies (pedagogy, andragogy, and didactics), with the goal of catalyzing transformative spiritual formation (paideia) across diverse contexts.

The modern Christian educator must transcend the mere transmission of information to become an agent of discipleship—capable of designing learning environments that model a coherent biblical worldview. This program equips graduate students with heuristic and systematic tools to evaluate, design, and implement curricula that promote integral growth and vocational service.

This two-year intensive program combines in-depth study of biblical-theological foundations with human development psychology and organizational theory, preparing professionals to:

- Assume leadership in educational institutions (schools, seminaries).
- Lead training and development ministries in local churches.
- Design teaching materials and strategies for all ages and cultures.
- Conduct applied research for the evaluation and continuous improvement of educational programs.

The M.A.C.E. at UNICA is the sine qua non program for those seeking to professionalize their educational vocation in service of the *Regnum Dei* (Kingdom of God).

Justification

The Master of Arts in Christian Education is justified by the paradigmatic crisis in how the Christian faith engages culture, demanding a qualitative leap from rote instruction toward Education for Transformation (*Mathetes*).



Today's context is marked by a functional spiritual illiteracy, where faith has become privatized and disconnected from public and professional life. In response, the Church needs architects of formation who:

- 1. Re-signify Theology as Telos: Christian education must serve as the *executive arm* of theology, translating doctrine into lived experience. It is necessary to overcome the dichotomy between the pulpit (theory) and the classroom (application), forming leaders who understand pedagogy as an intrinsically theological task.
- 2. Lead Sustainable Educational Systems: The continuity and accountability of educational ministries (Bible schools, chaplaincies, youth missions) depend on strategic management and robust curricular design. The program professionalizes such management, ensuring that human, financial, and technological resources are optimized for enduring spiritual impact.
- 3. Research and Cultural Discernment: The Master's program introduces rigorous research methods to evaluate the effectiveness of educational models in light of emerging realities (Neuroscience, Digital Culture, Globalization). Our graduates become expert evaluators who apply heuristic reasoning to discern the best pathways for Christian worldview formation in a pluralistic and complex environment.

Thus, the M.A.C.E. represents a strategic investment in the Church's maturity and prophetic mission, ensuring that the next generation of believers will be intellectually robust and spiritually grounded.

Graduates of UNICA's Master of Arts in Christian Education will be educational leaders with a theological vision, equipped to:

- 4. Applied Research: Employ research methodology to conduct needs assessments, evaluate program effectiveness, and propose evidence-based pedagogical innovations.
- 5. Spiritual Accompaniment: Integrate developmental psychology and pastoral counseling into the educational process, facilitating vocational discernment and spiritual maturity among learners.

Methodology and Evaluation

- Project-Based and Blended Methodology: Synchronous classes, case-study seminars, hands-on curricular design and assessment workshops, and individualized thesis research mentoring.
- Emphasis on Applied Research: The program requires a Final Graduate Project (12 credits), which may take the form of either:
 - o An original research thesis (contribution to knowledge), or
 - o A Professional Intervention Project (design and implementation of a curriculum or assessment system).
- Continuous Evaluation: Based on curricular prototypes, institutional diagnostic reports, academic papers, and public defense of the Final Graduate Project.

Institutional Observations and Compliance

Admission to the program requires a Bachelor's degree and, preferably, prior experience or a clear calling to educational/pastoral ministry. UNICA will adapt documents and admission requirements according to State of Texas regulations and the accreditation standards applicable to graduate programs.
